## STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

## **2023-24 SESSION**

A Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted among the students of Lilong Haoreibi College, Lilong. The survey represents the Key Indicator 2.7.1 under Criteria II on Teaching – Learning and Evaluation of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

The survey was conducted as per the guidelines of NAAC and aims to gather invaluable insights from the students about their experience and level of satisfaction in the college. The questionnaire includes questions ranging from the teaching skills of the teachers such as subject knowledge, preparation, communication skills, identifying the strengths and weaknesses of the students etc. to the overall aspects of the college such as infrastructure, providing the opportunities to ensure growth of students in various aspects, development of various skill sets etc. There is a total of 16 questions which includes 15 Likert scale questions with one openended question to elicit observation/suggestions from the students to improve the overall teaching-learning experience in the college.

## Methodology

The Likert scale questions are 5-point scale from 4 to 0, with the most positive response rated as 4 and most negative response rated as 0. The mean score for each question was calculated and the overall mean was at which gives the mean satisfaction level of the students. The survey was circulated to the students of all the departments for a period of 7 days and a total of 124 response was received.
