COLLEGE PROFILE

Established in the year 1976 under the initiative of a Governing body and later, taken over by the Government in the year 1979, Lilong Haoreibi College remains flourished under its uniqueness of being the only higher educational institute which is located at the educationally, economically and socially backward minority Muslim concentrated area of Manipur. The institute spreads over 16.78 acres of a beautiful landscape at Lilong Usoipokpi, Thoubal District, Manipur alongside the Indo-Myanmar highway at a distance of 15 kilometres from Imphal, the capital city of Manipur. The College has been recognized under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the University Grants Commission Act 1956.

The co-educational institute offers 14 undergraduate programmes in B.A. and B.Sc. (Four Year NEP Programmes) with 76 teaching faculties. The College has been approved under the University Grants Commission for conducting skill based job oriented B. Voc. Degree Programme in Agriculture from the academic session of 2020-21. The College has also begun add-on Programme in Tailoring from the academic session 2024-25.

With an annual average enrolment of about 2,000 plus students predominantly belonging to the socio-economically and educationally backward minority Muslim community, the College has the pride of having produced many toppers in the examinations conducted by the Manipur University.

The College has recently been accredited by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) for the 1st cycle with grade 'B' (2.39 CGPA). It is, especially in the last couple of years, has been in constant effort towards becoming at par with other premier institutes in the region. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College has also been giving its full devotion to ensure overall quality improvement of the College.

In line with the NEP 2020 recommendations, the College is poised to introduce the 4-year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) under the National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE) from this upcoming academic session, further enhancing its academic offerings. This initiative will offer BA. B.Ed. and BSc. B.Ed. programs.

Library Automation (semi) with the installation of KOHA software, subscription of N-LIST INFLIBNET facility, connection of BSNL Leased Line Internet facility with Wi-Fi enabled campus, smart classrooms and ICT facilities are some of the remarkable efforts in addition to others taken up by the College in the recent past with the sole devotion towards realizing its vision.

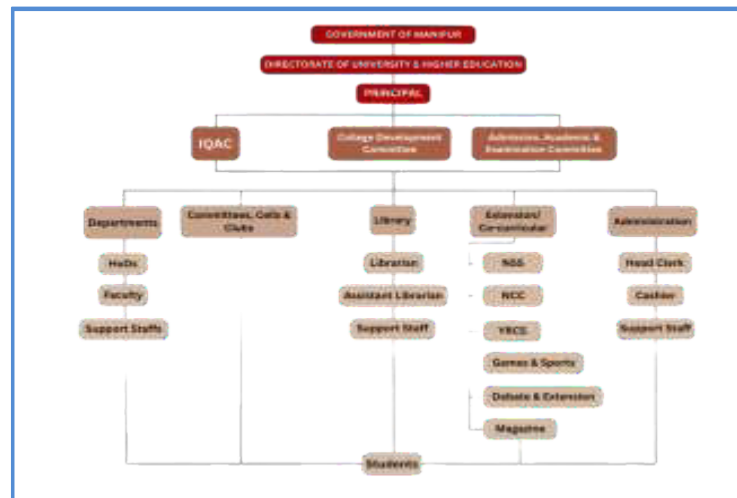

PROGRAMME DETAILS

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes of B.A. & B.Sc. offered in the College governed by the new MU Ordinance set in accordance with National Education Policy (NEP) contain the following course components:

1. Course Categories

The following types of courses and activities shall constitute the programme of study, each requiring a defined number of hours for classroom instruction, academic guidance, laboratory/studio/workshop sessions, field-based learning or projects, internships, and community engagement or service.

- A. **Major Course (60/80 credits):** The major enables students to pursue in-depth study in a specific discipline. Students may change their major within the broad disciplinary area at the end of the second semester, after exploring interdisciplinary courses in the first year. The minimum credit requirements for a Major course are 60 credits for a 3-year program and 80 credits for a 4-year program. Students are required to select any one of the following major subjects offered by the college: (1) Botany, (2) Zoology, (3) Chemistry, (4) Physics, (5) Mathematics, (6) Home Science, (7) Geography, (8) English, (9) Economics, (10) History, (11) Manipuri, (12) Political Science, (13) Philosophy.
- B. **Minor Course (24/32 credits):** Students may pursue disciplinary or interdisciplinary Minors, as well as skill-based courses aligned with a vocational stream of their interest. The minimum credit requirements for a Major course are 24 credits for a 3-year program and 32 credits for a 4-year program. Students are required to select any one of the following major subjects offered by the college: (1) Botany, (2) Zoology, (3) Chemistry, (4) Physics, (5) Mathematics, (6) Home Science, (7) Geography, (8) English, (9) Economics, (10) History, (11) Manipuri, (12) Political Science, (13) Philosophy.
- C. **Discipline Specific Elective:** DSEs are courses that form part of the major discipline. Students choose them from a pool of specialised courses offered within their subject area. In the fourth year, DSEs are often opted in lieu of a dissertation, allowing students to broaden and deepen their knowledge through coursework if they choose not to undertake a research project.
- D. **Multidisciplinary, MDC (9 credits):** These are 3 credit courses spanning over five groups of subjects- (a) *Natural and Physical Sciences*, (b) *Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications*, (c) *Library, Information, and Media Sciences*, (d) *Commerce and Management*, (e) *Humanities and Social Sciences*. Each student need to take any three papers each with three credits from the above five sub-groups during semester 1 to 3. Courses already studied at the 12th-grade (higher secondary school) level in the intended major or minor cannot be selected.
- E. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) (08 credits):** This is an 8 credit course covering Modern Indian Language (MIL) and English courses aim to develop students' proficiency through critical reading, academic writing, and effective communication.. Each student will take two papers: (a) Language and Communication Skills in either MIL or English in the first semester, and (b) Linguistics, Academic Writing and Professional Communication in either MIL or English in the second semester.
- F. **Skills Enhancement Courses (SEC) (09 credits):** These are various skill courses with total credit of 9. These courses are designed to provide practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to enhance students' employability. A student need to study the first skill course of 3 credit in the 1st Semester. The rest two skill papers, each having 2 credits need to be studied during semester 2 and 3.
- G. **Value-Added Courses (VAC) Common to All UG Students (6 credits):** This course aims to provide with a comprehensive understanding of contemporary India, rooted in its historical evolution, national development goals, knowledge of environmental changes, artificial Intelligence (AI), machine learning, big data analytics, 3D machining, drone technology, Yoga, sports , health care, social issues and ethics. It includes the following:
 - (a) Understanding India (b) Environmental science/education (c) Digital and technological solutions

H. Experiential Learning Components (4 Credits)

The undergraduate curriculum integrates experiential learning to connect theory with practice. Through internships or apprenticeships, community engagement, and field-based projects, students gain practical skills, professional exposure, and a deeper understanding of societal contexts, enhancing their academic learning and career readiness. Students can take any of the following:

- (a) *Summer Internship /Apprenticeship*
- (b) *Community engagement and service:*
- (c) *Field-based learning/minor project:*

1.2.. Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit Options and Certifications.

Lilong Haoreibi College, in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and Manipur University Ordinance, allows flexible system of multiple exit and entry for students. Under this system, a student can exit the programme, say after one year and then again can enter the programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where he/she left. This can be executed multiple. These multiple exits and entries at different stages are linked to corresponding academic certifications, as described below:

- (a) **Bachelor’s Certificate:** Students who choose to exit after the successful completion of the first year and have earned a minimum of 40 credits shall be awarded a UG Certificate, provided they also complete a vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the first year. Such students may re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years.
- (b) **Bachelor’s Diploma:** Students who choose to exit after the successful completion of the second year and have earned a minimum of 80 credits (40 from 1st Year and 40 from 2nd year) shall be awarded a UG Diploma, provided they also complete a vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the second year. Re-entry into the programme shall be permitted within three years.
- (c) **Three-Year Bachelor’s Degree:** Students who complete three years of study, earn a minimum of 120 credits, and meet the minimum credit requirements in the major discipline shall be awarded a UG Degree in the respective major upon exit.
- (d) **Four-Year Bachelor’s Degree (Honours):** A Four-Year UG Honours Degree in the major discipline shall be awarded to students who complete four years of study, earn a minimum of 160 credits, and fulfill the prescribed credit requirements. Students who do not undertake a research project/dissertation must complete three additional theory courses totaling 12 credits in lieu of the research component.
- (e) **Four-Year Bachelor’s Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 7.5 CGPA over the previous six semesters and choose to pursue research in the fourth year shall undertake a research project or dissertation under the supervision of a faculty member of the College. The research work must be within the major discipline. Students who complete 160 credits, including 12 credits from the research project/dissertation, shall be awarded a UG Degree (Honours with Research).

1.3.Duration of the undergraduate programmes:

Every student admitted to an undergraduate programme leading to a qualification from Level 4.5 to Level 6 shall be required to complete the whole programme within a maximum period of seven (7) years from the date of admission to the first semester.

If a student wishes to exit after a qualification level (Level 4.5 to Level 6), he/she shall be required to complete the programme within a period of 2 (two) years from the date of admission to the programme of each qualification level

SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS

The College shall strictly adhere to the rules set by Manipur University in respect of the scheme and system of examinations.

ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE

- (a) Every student should have at least 75% attendance in each semester to be eligible for appearing in the semester examination.
- (b) Students should maintain a high standard of discipline in the College. They have to follow the rules and regulations of the College.
- (c) College properties such as furniture, library books, toilets, lab equipments etc. should be treated with due care.
- (d) Smoking, drinking, abuse of drugs and other intoxicants, etc. in and around the College campus are strictly prohibited.
- (e) Students are to refrain from gossiping, making noise and loitering around the College verandah/corridor to ensure a peaceful academic atmosphere in the College Campus.
- (f) Students, both boys and girls, are required to follow a **“Uniform Dress Code”** prescribed by the College authority as listed hereunder:

Boys: Black Formal Trousers, Black Belt, White Shirt-Full/Half, Black Shoes, White Socks, Black Sweater/Blazer

Girls: Grey Phanek, White Shirt-Full/Half, Black Shoes, White Socks, Black Sweater/Blazer, Black Head Scarf (for Muslim Girls)
- (g) Students violating rules and regulations of the College are liable to be penalized.
- (h) Every student of Lilong Haoreibi College must carry in person a valid identity card issued by the College.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)

As per National Education Policy 2020, the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) has been envisaged to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the Higher Education Institutions in the country with an appropriate “credit transfer” mechanism from one programme to another, leading to attainment of a Degree/ Diploma/PG-diploma, etc. Under this system, credits awarded by registered institutions shall be credited into students' ABC accounts. The Academic bank credit(s) can only be shared from institutions, not directly from the student. Only credits submitted by an authorized institution will be accepted for storage and validation by the ABC.

APAAR, which stands for Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry, is a specialized identification system designed for all students in India. This initiative is part of the “One Nation, One Student ID” program launched by the Union government, aligning with the new National Education Policy of 2020. Every student admitted in the College is required to register for APAAR/ABC ID - a unique 12-digit code through <https://www.abc.gov.in/> to digitally store, manage, and access all their academic credits, including degrees, diplomas, certificates, training details, and co-curricular accomplishments. This ID functions as a digital identity for the student in the realm of education.



Library

The College has a large central library with more than 20,000 books. A photocopying machine of the College has already been installed in the administrative block along with fax and internet facilities. Students and teachers can enjoy this facility at concessional rate. The library is open to bonafide students of the College. Students, teachers and other staff members of the College are entitled to become members of the library.

Canteen

The College has a canteen availing tea, coffee, snacks, etc. to students, staffs and visitors at reasonable price.

Hostel

Spreading over vast area surrounded by green cover, the Lilong Haoreibi College has opened separate boys and girls hostels starting from the academic session 2019-20. These hostels, constructed by the MOBEDS, provide accommodation to many students coming from far flung corners of the state. Students can apply for hostel accommodation only after admission.

College Activities

Lilong Haoreibi College is proud of having an excellent playground which can be exploited to the best advantage by sports persons. The College organizes Inter-House Annual Sports Meet and Cultural & Literary Meet to explore the talents of the students.

National Service Scheme (NSS)***

To engage students in creative and constructive activities, to gain skill, personality, and leadership, three units of National service Scheme (NSS) have been opened with an involvement of 100 student volunteers in each unit. Normally, enrolment to this scheme is done with the commencement of a new academic session. Students who desire to join this scheme are advised to approach the NSS programme officers (POs).

National Cadet Corps (NCC)***

The College has well disciplined contingents of NCC Army Wings provided by the 14(M)Bn. under the charge of ANO, Dr. L. Dorendro Singh, Assistant Professor, Mathematics Department to facilitate the active participation of the students in the social programmes like blood donation, community service, disaster management, Traffic Awareness etc and also to groom them into disciplined and patriotic citizens. Any student of the College may join NCC subject to physical fitness.

***** Weightage of 2 marks in overall index is given to those students who have participated in NSS Camps/passed NCC (C Certificate) Course while applying for admission to PG courses in the Manipur University.**

Excursion/study tours

External /Internal study tours for certain subjects are compulsory for every student enrolled in the concerned degree course as prescribed by the University from time to time as a part of the course.

Co-curricular activities

Under experienced guides, to build up personalities and instill leadership qualities to students of this College, the College organizes co-curricular activities/programmes such as Debating competition, Ex-tempore speech Competition, One act play, Public speaking, Quiz contest, etc.



SCHOLARSHIPS, INCENTIVES AND AWARDS

Students can apply through the Principal of the College, for Merit Scholarships, etc. to the Directorate of University & Higher Education; INSPIRE Scholarships to the Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India and the ISHAN UDAY Scholarships to the UGC, New Delhi. Besides these, students who topped with meritorious performance in academics, sports, competitions as well as in NSS Camps/NCC courses of the College shall be honoured and awarded with cash prizes and citations in a well organized ceremony.
